ABOUT PAUL SPICER

Paul Spicer is best known as the founder and conductor of the London-based choral ensemble the Finzi Singers. With this popular 18-member group, Spicer has made numerous recordings and given countless concerts not only in the London area but throughout the U.K. and abroad. Spicer and his ensemble specialize in 20th century British choral music, a

category that would of course take in music by the group's namesake, Gerald Finzi, as well as works by Elgar, Holst, Vaughan Williams, Britten, Moeran, Walton, Tippett, and many others. Although on the international scene Spicer's career has been closely identified with the Finzi Singers, he has also served, often concurrently, as conductor of four other choral ensembles: the

Royal College of Music Chamber Choir, Whitehall Choir, Birmingham Bach Choir, and the Birmingham Conservatoire Chamber Choir. In addition, Spicer is on the faculty at the Royal College of Music as a professor of choral conducting. He is also very active as a composer, regularly receiving prestigious commissions and performances at such venues as Wigmore Hall and at the Lichfield Festival. Spicer's output takes in much choral music, but also includes chamber, orchestral, and various instrumental and solo vocal works. Spicer's recordings are available on a variety of labels, including Chandos, Hyperion, and Regent Records, the latter issuing a fair number of Spicer's own compositions.

Paul Spicer was born in Bowdon, England, in 1952. He was a chorister at New College, Oxford University, and studied music at London's Royal College of Music under Herbert Howells and, for organ performance, Richard Popplewell. From 1974-1984 Spicer taught music at the Uppingham School and Ellesmere College. In 1984 he accepted a post as producer for BBC Radio 3, and two years later became a senior producer for the Midlands Region. Spicer founded the Finzi Singers in 1987, and from 1990-2001 served as artistic director of the Lichfield International Arts Festival and director of the Abbotsholme Arts Society.

Meanwhile, Spicer was quite busy as a composer: his 1984 choral work Come out, Lazar (CD available on Regent Records, from 2009), 1987-1988 Piano Sonata (for Margaret Fingerhut), and 2000 Easter Oratorio, for vocal soloists, choirs, and orchestra were gaining notice. Spicer also continued to work as a record producer and concert organist. Among Spicer's later works is the 2009 Advent Oratorio: The Biblical Hope of the Coming Of God, for vocal soloists, choirs, organ, and orchestra.

ABOUT LORI HETZEL

Lori Hetzel is the Associate Director of the School of Music, Associate Director of Choral Activities and Full Professor of Choral Music Education at the University of Kentucky where she conducts the UK Women's Choir and the ever-popular a cappella group "Paws and Listen". In addition to her conducting duties, Dr. Hetzel supervises

student teachers and teaches undergraduate methods and choral conducting courses where she has pioneered a unique partnership program with area high schools and middle schools allowing undergraduate students to begin classroom teaching early in their curriculum and gain true 'hands on' experience.

Hetzel is a contributing author to the new textbook Conducting Women's Choirs: Strategies for Success. Among her many academic accomplishments, she was the recipient of the University of Kentucky "Great Teacher of the Year" award in 2000, a finalist for the Provost Awards for

Outstanding Teaching in both 2009 and 2010, and the winner of the Robert K. Baar Choral Award in 2011 3/4 "given to one choral director in the state who exhibits outstanding leadership in choral music and promotes music education in the state of Kentucky." Lori Hetzel received the Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Wisconsin/Green Bay, the Master of Music from the University of Missouri/Kansas City and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Michigan State University.

Outside of the university, Dr. Hetzel serves as Artistic Director of the Lexington Singers Children's Choir and conducts the LSCC Chamber Choir. The Lexington Singers Children's Choir was formed to provide specialized choral opportunities for the children of central Kentucky and now offers four select choirs in which children can participate. The group performs not only in the greater Lexington area but has also presented concerts with the Indianapolis Children's Choir - Kantorie, the Spivey Hall Children's Choir (Atlanta), the Central Illinois Children's Choir, the Vanderbilt Children's Choir, and at the Kennedy Center as part of the *Our Lincoln* concert presented by the Kentucky Arts Council. They are often seen in collaboration with other area musical groups including The Lexington Singers, Lexington Philharmonic, UK Opera Theater and the UK Choirs. In 2014 the Chamber Choir was invited to perform at the American Choral Directors Association Southern Division Convention in Jacksonville, FL where they premiered the Raymond W. Brock Memorial Commissioned piece by Alice Parker.

Johnson is presently Music Director of the Lexington Singers. The 180-voice community chorus annually performs major works with the Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra. The Singers have toured internationally, most recently to Brazil, France, Italy, and Austria. In 2000 the chorus performed Mozart's *Requiem* with the Vienna Mozart Orchestra in the famous Hofburg Palace and sang the evening mass at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris. In 2003 the chorus performed in St. Marks Cathedral in Venice and sang mass at St. Peters Basilica in Vatican City. In 1999 the Lexington Singers celebrated its 40th anniversary with a performance in New York City as Johnson made his Carnegie Hall debut conducting the Singers and orchestra in Faure's *Requiem*.

Johnson maintains an active schedule as an adjudicator and guest conductor for high-school and collegiate choirs throughout the United States. He has conducted honor choruses in 30 states and has appeared as a featured clinician at ACDA or MENC conventions in Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia.

Lane Moore taught both choral and instrumental music at Pendleton High School for 20 years and choral music at Dorman High School for 14 years. During those times, students in those programs accomplished many prestigious honors and many of them are now teachers and/or performers. He retired from education in 2010 after 35 years in education. He continues to serve as the accompanist/assistant conductor of the Foothills Chorale based in Clemson, SC. He has also continued to serve as a clinician or

accompanist in clinics throughout the state. He served as one of the accompanists at the South Carolina All State Clinics for over 10 years. He was instrumental in the formation of the third choir - an all-male choir to be an official part of the All State weekend. While serving as the South Carolina State President of the ACDA, he formed the two high school choirs that are still a part of the fall conference of the state ACDA. ABOUT DON R. CAMPBELL

Don Campbell is Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Southern Wesleyan University in Central, South Carolina. Prior to his appointment at SWU in 1998, he taught vocal music for 20 years at Redwood High School in Visalia, California—building the program to 300 students in five choirs. Dr. Campbell received his Bachelor of Arts degree in music education from California State University, Fullerton, his Master of Arts degree in choral conducting from California State University, Fresno, and his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting from Arizona State University. His mentors include David

Thorsen, Howard Swan, John Cooksey, Greg Lyne, David Stocker, and many others.

In demand as a choral clinician, Dr. Campbell has traveled to fourteen states and Scotland, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Australian, and British Columbia and Ontario, Canada to conduct choirs and festival choruses and present choral clinics. Every year he conducts the South Carolina Music Educators Association's Upper Region Honor Choir and had for many years also conducted the Central Region Honor Choir. His choirs have performed at conventions of the American Choral Directors Association and Music Educators National Conference. He is the founder and host of four festivals for local school and church choirs at Southern Wesleyan University: Upstate Intercollegiate Choral Invitational Festival for college choirs, SWUFest for high school choirs, SWUFest Too for middle school choirs, and Musica Ecclesia for church choirs.

Dr. Campbell is currently the conductor of the Chorale of the Greater Anderson Musical Arts Consortium (GAMAC), a fine civic chorale in Anderson, South Carolina. As a barbershopper, he has directed Visalia, California's Mighty Oak Chorus, Hanford, California's Kingsmen Chorus, and Spartanburg, South Carolina's Palmetto Statesmen Chorus and has been on the international faculty of Harmony University for the Barbershop Harmony Society for sixteen years. He is a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia (Professional Music Fraternity), Phi Kappa Phi (Honorary Scholastic Society), Pi Kappa Lambda (Honorary Music Scholastic Society), American Choral

Directors Association, South Carolina American Choral Directors Association, Music Educators National Conference, South Carolina Music Educators Association, National Association of Teachers of Singing, and the Barbershop Harmony Society.

As a church musician, Dr. Campbell has directed music at several churches in California and South Carolina including his current position as Director of Music at Trinity United Methodist Church in Anderson, South Carolina. He has also had lead roles in community theatre productions of *Man of La Mancha* and *Fiddler on the Roof*. He is recipient of the first Ken Dickens Award for Excellence in Teaching for 2003 at Southern Wesleyan University and SWU's Faculty Member of the Year for 2003-4. Additional honors include being recently elected president of the South Carolina American Choral Directors Association, being named Dean of the Directing College of Harmony University, and contributing to *Visions of Excellence: a Dialog with the Finest Directors from the Barbershop Harmony Society*.

Jane Palmer Dill is Professor of Piano and Theory at Southern Wesleyan University where she serves as Chair of the Fine Arts Division.
